



# Altmore Infant School -Sports Premium Report 2015-2016 including 2016-2017 Key Priorities



November 2016

## **Overview**

Across our Federation and particularly at Lathom, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children. As PE subject leader, I have identified key priorities that will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.

### **What is the Sports Premium?**

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers' to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years - here at Altmore Infant School this will mean around £9,000 a year. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. Recently the government have committed to funding the primary school Sports Premium up until 2020 - an investment worth £750 million.

### **Purpose of the funding**

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

### **Possible uses of the funding include:**

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits.

# Altmore Infant School 2016-2017 Key Priorities

- Staff to attend CPD through school Langdon school partnership.
- Collaborate more closely with PE subject leader at the Junior School
- Update PE scheme of work to continue to improve lesson delivery.
- Supply pupils (PP disadvantage groups) with more access to extended school clubs
- Supply spare PE kits for all classes -to ensure 100% participation in every PE lesson.
- Supply appropriate PE kit for staff
- Subject leader to attend CPD. to enhance the use of Assessment in PE
- Work alongside the Gifted and Talented subject leader to identify pupils with exceptional sporting ability.
- Partner with the lead teacher for Teaching and Learning to review how sports can be used in a cross-curricular context
- Arrange PE trips/events outside of partnership competitions to help raise aspirations.
- Meet with local sports clubs to promote participation of pupils outside the 'school offer'
- To monitor PE delivery across the curriculum and model lessons through a team teach approach with teachers
- Continue to update resources and equipment for extra classes and introduce new sporting games and activities.
