



It's good to talk

It has come to our attention that when some parents collect their child from school, they are often so pre-occupied with talking on their mobile phones, they don't ask how their child's day was. Please put the phone away; give your child your full attention and the benefit of a good language model when you pick them up at the end of the school day. Opposite are some ideas for engaging questions you might ask your child...

10 'WHAT' questions to ask your child about their day

- What was the funniest thing you heard today?
- What was the hardest thing you had to do at school today?
- What was your favourite thing that happened today?
- What subject was the most interesting today?
- What did you do at break time? Who did you play with?
- What are you learning about in your topic lessons?
- What happened today that you wish hadn't happened?
- What was something new that you read today?
- What did you enjoy most for lunch today?
- What rules are different at school than at home?
